

## **Fastest Growing Companies**

## Where sales grow by leaps and bounds

FastSpring's sales jumped 1,351.5 percent in three years, the kind of growth usually seen only in very young startups. Yet its executives say that kind of explosive growth may be far from over.

Santa Barbara-based FastSpring, started in 2005, works to make selling easier for purveyors of downloadable digital products such as software, PDF reports, e-books and video games. Being a player in its niche means providing the usual e-commerce tasks, such as payment processing, as well as services such as digital rights management.

Dan Engel co-founded the company, along with three others, after successfully selling a company to Google. The four founders started the firm with their own money, turned a profit a year later, and have watched it grow in leaps and bounds since, with more than 8,500 clients signed up

"We all came from software backgrounds, and we saw an unmet need out there that wasn't being addressed," said Tim Dir, FastSpring's director of finance. Fast-Spring provides off-the-shelf products for e-commerce sellers so that they can focus on what they do best — developing and selling their digital offerings — rather than spend time and money building out their own e-commerce platforms.

It's turned out to be lucrative area of the market to corner. FastSpring pulled in \$36.6 million in sales last year, up from \$11.7 million in 2009 and \$2.5 million in 2008. "We've done all of this through a bad economy," Dir said.

The company prides itself on customer service and often responds to client issues in under an hour. "We're kind of nuts about customer support. We're the kind of geeks who vendors want supporting them," Engel told the Business Times last year.

Over the past year, FastSpring has unveiled SaaSy, a new subscription-based e-commerce platform aimed at software-as-a-service, or SaaS, providers.

The company operates out of a one-room office in downtown Santa Barbara, where nobody but Dir was to be seen on a recent Friday afternoon. Laid back in the tech exec uniform of Santa Barbara — T-shirt, jeans and flip-flops — Dir said the firm maintains the small offices because its employees often work from home, in coffee shops, on the road, even as far away as Georgia.

"Our guys are always on their laptops and smart-

phones," he said. If a client email comes through, it's often a matter of mere minutes before the first FastSpring person jumps on it and shoots off a reply.

The firm currently has 20 employees and is "always hiring," Dir said, as it continues to grow.

Now, it's focusing on catching the larger fish in the

market. "We could go after a client now that could double our revenue," he said.

It's a growing market. E-commerce sales are outpacing the overall U.S retail market, according to recent figures from the U.S. Census Bureau. Total e-commerce sales in the U.S. were \$47.5 billion in the second quarter, up 3 percent over for the first quarter and 17.6 percent year-over-year. In contrast, overall retail sales in the U.S. were up 1.2 percent from the first quarter and 8.1 percent year-over-year.

In another sign that the e-commerce space is heating up, a Boston private equity firm paid \$115 million earlier this month for FastSpring competitor Plimus. Like FastSpring, Plimus provides an e-commerce platform for companies that sell digital products, and it has a user base of more than 6,500.

"It's great to see some activity in our space," Dir said. An acquisition or initial public offering of FastSpring's stock remains a strong possibility down the road, he said, but for now the firm is focused on continued growth and new product development.

"There are new companies starting every day that can use our products," he said.
